

What Are Stem Cells?

Stem cell - /'stem sel/

Noun • an undifferentiated cell of a multicellular organism that is capable of giving rise to indefinitely more cells of the same type, and from which certain other kinds of cells arise by differentiation

Simply stated:

- Stem cells are your body's internal repair system.
- Stem cells are the foundation cells for our bodies, and they repair injured tissue and replace cells that are damaged every day.
